Educational Objectives:

At the conclusion of this activity, the participant should be able to: Demonstrate a working knowledge of pharmacogenetic predictors of antidepressant response; understand the difficulties and challenges in providing mental health services to inmates; understand the evolution of the mental health care delivery system and the psychiatrists who played a role in the 19th and 20th centuries; demonstrate a knowledge of the number of mental health and addiction services that promotes recovery and self-sufficiency for people with mental illness and addictions; understand the historical context and perspective of the film, “One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest”, and the socio-cultural and allegorical interpretations of the film; demonstrate a knowledge of the five key components of Telecare’s Recovery model and essentials to creating a recovery ecosystem; understand the history and functions of the EAST team, and the challenges of implementing early intervention; demonstrate a knowledge of how psychiatrists in different settings manage and treat chronic mentally ill patients; understand the reasons, opportunities and barriers for child and adolescent psychiatry collaboration with primary care medical clinicians; identify specific components of public/private partnership, operational components of integrated mental health care and understand the role of a community hospital in local mental health care; understand the difference between the legal principle of privilege and the therapeutic principle of privilege, and describe the initial steps in assessing the limits of legally-defined privilege; demonstrate the many different ways the Oregon State Hospital contributes to the Oregon mental health system and the new informed consent process and its clinical effects; understand what public psychiatry is in academics and government, and whether there is a need for discrete identification.
