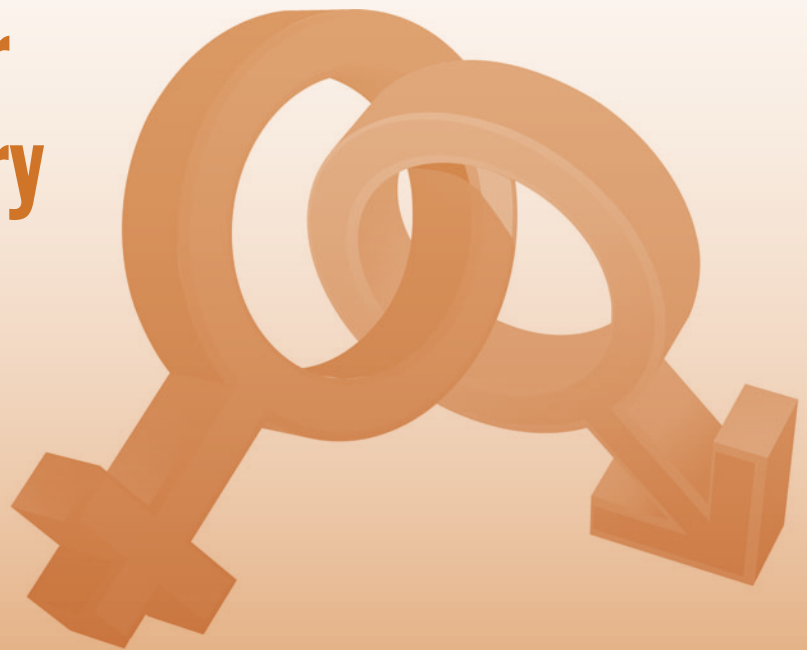

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of this activity, the participants should be able to: identify misunderstandings of sexual boundary violations and the eight risk factors associated with them; explore aspects of erotic transference and countertransferences, especially relative to the multiple meanings underlying erotic transferences as a defensive structure; highlight needs of the therapist over time focusing on prevention of ethical violations through self-care; understand ways gender and sexuality are ongoing cultural constructions and the role power plays in these categories; understand the innovations to psychoanalytic theory that feminist, queer and postmodern theories have stimulated; understand how cultural norms about gender and sexuality may affect how they approach patients; know key elements in the development of contemporary sex therapy; recent research on physiological factors in variations of sexual response; discuss changes in sexual problems and therapeutic approaches since Masters and Johnson; learn factors involved in current controversies in sexology; clarify terminology for sexual and gender development and identity; improve skills in identifying youths at risk for mental health problems with regard to sexual or gender minority issues; offer reliable resources for those who identify, treat or refer these patients; raise awareness in creating safe spaces for sexual and gender minority individuals; understand how and why child sexual abuse affects adult sexuality; learn skills for asking about this abuse and appropriate responses to the distress associated with disclosure; learn psychotherapeutic interventions to apply when sexual distress issues arise; know the basic components of a comprehensive sex offense risk assessment and the tenets of sex-offense specific treatment; identify empirically supported static and dynamic factors associated with recidivism and learn current treatment trends, including the "Risk-Need-Responsivity" principles of 4th generation assessment and intervention; learn the concepts that comprise comprehensive risk management strategies; recognize and diagnose personality and family issues as seen in *Henry IV, Part One* and discuss those philosophical and psychological dynamics; define "sexuality"; understand current literature in geriatric sexual health, including expected age-related physical, social and psychological changes; increase awareness of the most common and concerning sexual issues in the geriatric population and the overall role sexuality plays in their quality of life and demonstrate knowledge of current treatment options; know two psychoanalytic theories of pornography; learn a clinical stance useful in working with patients involved in pornography; understand the role of SNS activation in SRI-AASD; identify gender differences in psychotropic-related sexual behaviors; examine treatment options for psychotropic-related sexual dysfunction; better understanding of issues relating to identity, prejudice, stereotyping, victimization, justice, morality, persecution, emotional and financial bonding as well as values that are deeply ingrained in culture and as seen in the complex structure of the *Merchant of Venice*.
