Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of the meeting, attendees will be able to understand the extent of the methamphetamine abuse problem in the community, including its affect on children of methamphetamine users; and impact on the judicial, law enforcement systems, and the Department of Human Services. Participants will learn about the genetics of methamphetamine addiction, the consequences of methamphetamine exposure on development, the role of impulsivity & risk taking in drug abuse, the medical comorbidities of substance abuse, and the latest information on prevention of substance abuse behaviors. Participants will also be able to understand treatment of substance abuse and the ASAM placement criteria; use of the Matrix Model of treatment; treatment of difficult populations; the use of alternative treatments for addictions; treatment of co-occurring addictions; and treatment of addictive behaviors associated with computers. The participants will have an opportunity to ask questions of faculty about treatment of patients or other pertinent issues.
